

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SHORT VVTERM ENGLISH PROGRAM



The Short-Term ESL Program (STEP) is open to all non-native English speakers seeking to improve English language proficiency.

STEP accepts all ages and English levels. STEP is fully customizable and ranges in length from 3 – 8 weeks. Program highlights include beach days, camping, golfing, skiing, hiking, hockey, curling, bowling and barbeques. Niagara Falls, CN tower and other major attractions in the Toronto area can also be arranged.

All Short-Term English Program students live with a Canadian family (homestay) and are fully immersed in the English Language. In cooperation with our institutional partners CANASIAN Academic Adventures can offer fully accredited ESL programs focusing on:

- Volunteerism
- Canadian Culture and Experience
- Preparation for Academic Study
- Canadian Fine and Indigenous Arts
- English for Specific Purposes (business, entrepreneurship, leadership, etc.)

Short Term English Programs offer:

- TESL and/or OCT certified Instructors
- Deep exposure to English in both a formal and informal capacity
- Placement tests to determine appropriate level
- 25+ hours/week of language instruction + cultural activities and/ or volunteer work.

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ENGLISH for ACADEMIC PURPOSES

The English for Academic Purposes Program accepts non-native English Speakers seeking to improve their language skills before pursuing academic endeavors.

EAPP are based on 5 levels of achievement. Each level is 14 weeks in length and offers 24 – 32 hours/week of formal ESL instruction.

EAPP students can choose to live in residence, homestay or find their own accommodations.

In cooperation with our institutional partners CANASIAN Academic Adventures can offer:

- Languages Canada accredited curriculum
- TESL certified/experienced Instructors
- Small Class sizes (5 15 students per class)
- Placements test upon arrival to determine appropriate level of study (see chart)
- An integrated skills approach combining listening, speaking, reading, writing, grammar, research and independent skills development
- Personalized instruction for various academic streams (business, computer science, humanities, etc.)
- Options to audit academic classes to experience a Canadian university setting
- One-to-One tutorials

To be Eligible for Academic Study, You Must:

1 Be a secondary school graduate and/or be a graduate/ transfer student from a post-secondary institution.

2 Provide one of the following Proof of English Language Proficiency:

- Successful completion of ESL @ Algoma Level 4 (with 80% or higher) or the Bridging Program
- TOEFL score of 550 (paper-based) 213 (computer based) and 79-80 (internet based)
- IELTS 6.0 (min. 6.0 on each band score)
- Pearson Test of English (PTE) 63
- CAEL 60

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3 Satisfy any other entry requirements for the chosen academic program (ex. GPA).
